Chairman's Report - Peter Mitchell

As you will read in the reports below there has been a lot of action over the last 9 months. I have just returned today from an excellent one-and-a-half-hour workshop held in the Weston hall where there were 64 farmers (staff and owners) present. The topic was wintering cows to a high standard... a topic targeting the winter grazing season about to start for 2019.

Comprising of 4 x 20 minute presentations covering compliance obligations, animal welfare, nutrient management and soil management, I have no doubt everyone learnt something. I have been Farming for 30 years and I learnt that I need to keep developing my sediment loss mitigation practices and for a healthy soil I need to check that I have at least 10 worms in every spade full!!!

As an arable farmer I was pleased I went along, but what I was more pleased about was that this workshop was the first one to be instigated by one of Noslam's pod group members – a new farmer stepping up and taking a lead.

Working alongside our co-ordinator, it was well organised and coordinated with a high level of engagement. It was so encouraging to see so many new faces in the room, many of whom were our local farm hands who came with the farm / land owners.

I have always said one of the most important things we do as NOSLaM is provide a platform that will get farmers engaged to help make a positive difference on their farm and on the wider environment. I have no doubt that today's workshop helped achieve exactly that.

Secretary /Treasurers Report – Jane Smith

It has been an extremely action packed start to the year — with our continued focus on the operational activities based around our POD group model. The launch of the Waiareka Phosphorous project (funded by NOIC) and major riparian projects (such as Cants Road and Kakanui) have meant an ever increasing portfolio of activity, yet a very efficient use of our funding partner's contributions with all projects taking the format of dual funding between NOSLaM and community groups and entities. This has benefits far greater than fiscal savings — collaboration, community engagement and stakeholder ownership in shaping the future of NOSLaM.

With a ramping up of activity, our budget is aligning well, given the considerable (yet prudent) underspend in the 17/18 financial year. Investment in communications will be increasing further within our budget over the next 3 -6 months (communication with both our farmer members and our wider network of community groups and stakeholders). We are delighted with the NOSlaM website and we continue to focus on social media communication alongside our tried and true postal newsletter model to the wider community.

Thank you again to our funding partners, NOIC, ORC, WDC and McKenzie & Co for their continued support, mentoring and encouragement.
